## Parent Pay

The school is launching a new online cashless payment system from the 28th October 2019. Money for school lunches and trips will only be accepted through this system.

You will receive a letter from the school office **TOMORROW** (Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> October) marked private and confidential with your child's unique username and password for a ParentPay account.

The only money that will accepted into school will be for the extended services (Breakfast Club, Educare and Afterschool Club) but please note these services can be paid through your employer as tax free childcare vouchers. The companies registered to the school are Eden Red and the Computer Share Voucher scheme.

If your child receives free school meals or universal free school meals (Reception and Key Stage 1) can we please ask you to create your account as you will be required to pay for school trips through this system. Please could we ask you to have your account setup **by Friday 18th October**. The school will receive notifications when parents have completed their registration.

The NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme is visiting our school on Thursday this week to make sure our pupils have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse.

This is a nationwide programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly to the children in our school as well as workshops for Years 5 and 6.

### **What is the 'Speak Out, Stay Safe' programme?**

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language.

We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we're convinced children will feel empowered –

knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.



### **Talking PANTS with your children**

Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.

### Domestic Violence

Debbie Cook, our Educational Support Manager has trained to be a 'Domestic Violence Champion' and is a resource available to any adult who would like to confidentially share incidents with her and is a very good source of

Domestic violence is on the increase and causes terrible harm to victims and the associated children.

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure it is eradicated. We are working closely with the Police and the school will learn of any incidents to support any children whose lives are affected by such an occurrence.

### Foodbank

The Foodbank is designed to help individuals and families in crisis through the provision of emergency food supplies. Local professional care-workers within Allerdale and Copeland refer them, with a food voucher, to the Foodbank centre where they are given food supplies, a cup of coffee and help in finding other professionals who can help them out of their crisis. ### Nursery Intakes

Children born between **1 September 2016** and **31 December 2016** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week Nursery education from **January 2020**.

If you know of any children with birth dates between these times and would like their child to come to this school, then please ask them to get in touch with the School Office as soon as possible.

Children born between **1 January 2017** and **31 March 2017** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **April 2020**.

Children born between **1 April 2017** and **31 August 2017** can receive their free 15 or 30 hours a week from **September 2020**.



Forms for applying for any of these intakes are available from the School Office or just ring and we can post them out.

**Please let friends/relatives know we now have a number of spaces for Nursery in January and April and can enrol children from their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday for 15 hours and for the full 30 hours from the term after their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday.**

## Beckstone's Extended Services

Our extended services include the Breakfast Club (£4.00 from 7.30am, £3.50 from 8am); Educare (our popular afternoon child care provision for morning Nursery children – see table below) Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.

Beckstone Xtra (again £3.50 an hour) runs from the end of the school day until 5.15pm



The prices for our extended services are extremely competitive to support families in these difficult economic times. The price per hour is only £3.50. This is very good value and an extremely competitive rate for child care.

## Carer & Toddler Club

This runs every Wednesday afternoon from 1.30 to 3pm. There is no cost to join but a £3.00 levy is charged to cover the cost of refreshments etc. Please spread the word as there are many spare spaces now the last cohort has joined Reception

## Cars on Eadie Street



Please can anyone collecting children from school avoid using



Eadie Street (which is residents' parking only) and certainly **DO NOT ATTEMPT A 3-POINT TURN** there. There were 2 occasions in the last month where a vehicle collecting children has done just that and has narrowly missed a child. Some of our children are very small and cannot be seen easily in a rear view mirror. We are sure that if anyone injured a child in such a way, they would find it very difficult to live with themselves.

**Remove any danger by not picking up in a vehicle on Eadie Street.**

## Church Road Crossing Proposals

There is currently a consultation on proposals for a Puffin crossing and consequently reduced parking on Church Road. A copy of the details sent to local residents is reproduced on the next page. You will note the new crossing is proposed to be placed just up from the Catholic Church, a different location to the traditional school crossing in front of the shops.

**CHURCH ROAD, HARRINGTON – PUFFIN CROSSING AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS**

The purpose of this letter is to invite any comments that you may have relating to the proposed removal of a section of parking bay on Church Road, in order to accommodate the construction of a new signalised crossing, as per the attached drawing.

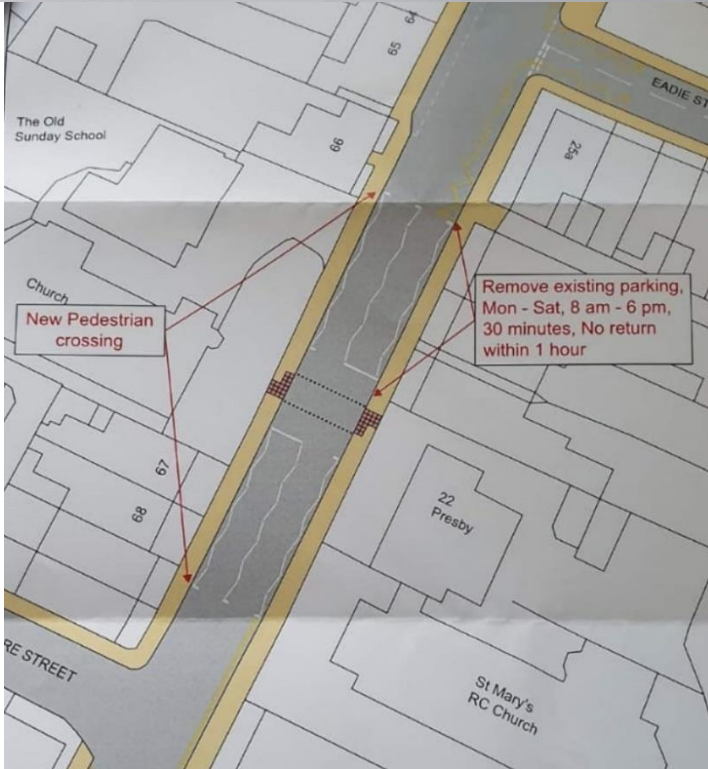
The crossing is proposed in conjunction with recent housing developments in the area, and the likely increase in footfall as a result. The crossing is positioned in a location to assist pedestrian access to and from the nearby school, as well as other local amenities.

**Walk to School – Feet First**

We aim to improve the health and fitness of our youngsters and reduce congestion and the hazard of traffic outside school. ## Breakfast Club Sandwiches

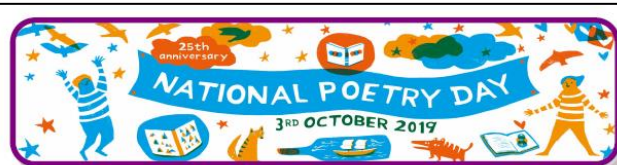

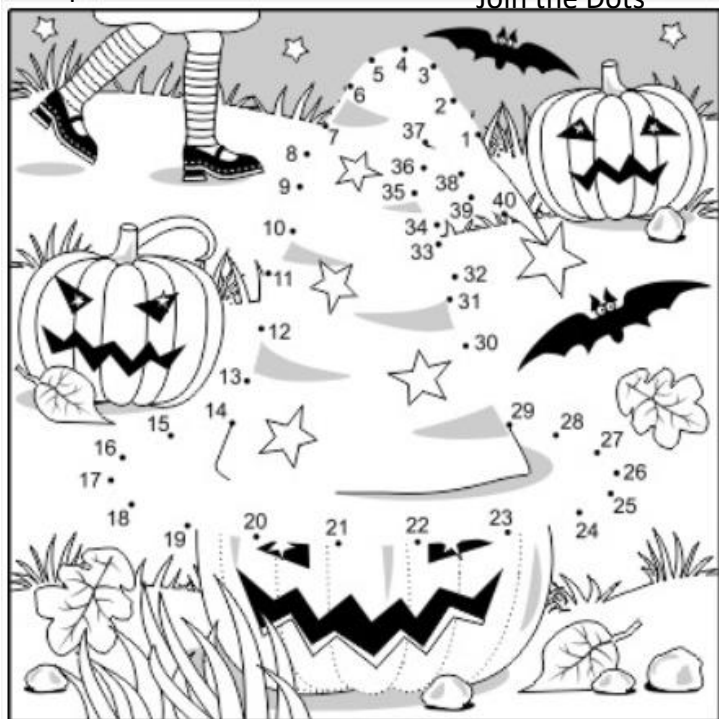
