

**Sharing information is in the best interests of children and their safeguarding. The school reserves the right to share and receive information from other agencies that may have had dealings with your child.**

If you ever have any concerns about the safety or wellbeing of a child, then you can ring your concerns through to the County's 24 hour 'Safeguarding Hub' number and you can remain anonymous if you wish. Callers can outline their concerns and the Safeguarding Hub will give advice (consultation) and if necessary, undertake an assessment of need.

## KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN EDUCATION

### WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

**WHAT IS SAFEGUARDING?**

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is defined as: protecting children from maltreatment preventing impairment of children's health or development; ensuring the children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care and taking action enable all children to have the best outcomes.

A child means everyone under the age of 18.

Children need the right help at the right time to address risks.

Remember "it could happen here" where safeguarding is a concern

We are all responsible for the welfare of children, whatever our job

**What do I need to do?**

**ALWAYS ACT**  
in the best interests of the child. Never compromise confidentiality.

**KNOW HOW**  
to identify children who may benefit from early help.

**KNOW THE DIFFERENCE**  
types of abuse and neglect so that you can identify children who may be in need of help and protection.

**Know what to do if a child tells you they are being abused or neglected.**

**Know who the designated Safeguarding Lead is and talk to them as soon as you have a concern.**

**Everyone must read the Keeping Children Safe in Education Part 1 and Annex A and the Child Protection Policy.**

**Any staff member can make a referral to Children's Social Care but MUST inform the Designated Safeguarding officer as soon as possible.**

**Staff Behaviour**

If you are concerned about the behaviour of any staff member you should speak to the Headteacher or Chair of Governors.

**Whistleblowing**

If you are concerned about poor or unsafe safeguarding practices, or potential failures in school, talk to the Safeguarding Lead, any SLT member or the Chair of Governors. If you feel unable to talk to anyone in school, you can call the NSPCC helpline, on 0800 028 0285



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### Safeguarding Children – A Place of Safety

Running after school clubs and after school care requires robust systems to ensure safety at all times. Any system however is subject to human error either by an adult who in the highly busy end of the day time forgets to give out a lanyard or a child forgetting a club or a number of other factors. We do try to impress on all the children in assemblies that if they realise something is amiss e.g. a parent is not in the place they said they would be then they MUST come back to school and we will help them from there. The front of the school is ALWAYS open even if the back gates get locked. Please stress this to them if they use clubs/care after school.

### Reading With Your Child



This is SO VERY important to your child's development and has come up as an issue at pupil progress meetings as many children are not being asked to read or being read to regularly. This needs to be put right, please can everyone make this a New Year resolution.



### Names in Clothing

**The lost property box was bulging at the end of term!!!** Please, please, please put your child's name in their clothing. When this happens, their clothing is easily returned. The amount of money some families lose by not doing this is staggering when you see how much is left unclaimed!





## Gritting

The school does not own the land outside the fenced area and as such does not have the responsibility to grit the paths and have been advised not to. However out of good will and to support our families we will grit as best as we can when we can. If it is very icy, please don't always rely on this and an alternative route can be taken using the steps and entering through the gates at the front to walk round the back if that is the way you or your child comes onto site.



## Extreme Weather/Heating Emergencies

With winter here, it is to be hoped that inclement weather is not serious, and that the heating system works effectively. If this happens not to be the case and the school is forced to close, then the following will be sources of information.

- A text message will be sent to all parents (***it is of vital importance we have an up to date mobile number contacts for every child***)
- The Cumberland Council web site carries information on schools that are closed
- Radio Cumbria will be informed and closure details will be included in their broadcasts

The school web site will be updated underneath the 'Weather Warnings' link.

It is very rare for the school to close and it has to be something very serious to do so.

## Attendance

Please can all families ensure their child attends school as regularly as possible and on time – indeed this is a statutory duty on parents.

There is a duty on schools to chase up any children who are missing when the school is not informed. This used to be passed to the Police but now the Police won't act unless the school carries out a home visit first. On a couple of occasions recently school staff have had to be taken out of their usual roles to carry out home visits (a minimum of 2 staff have to carry out the visits). As you can imagine this is a huge drain in resources on a school day. On every occasion to date it has been a result of families not informing the school of illness and not answering phones, responding to texts or emails!! Please can all parents ensure the inform school when their child is not attending to prevent this happening.



All schools are referring any child who has 10 unauthorised absences to the County Attendance Officer. The Attendance Officer, Linzi Bennet, will then be in touch with those families and will send a warning letter or a fixed penalty notice.

The decision to issue fines is not made by the school and any money that comes from this goes to the County NOT schools.



## Term Time Holidays & Tests



There is active discouragement of taking holidays in term time as it disrupts a child's learning.

# FOOD & DRINK

## Food & Drink

- **School Meals** currently cost £15.50 per week (only £3.10 a day) payable on ParentPay. This is great value when

you look at prices of goods in supermarkets for packed lunches and the hassle of putting them together. We would recommend a hot meal for all the children, particularly as we are in the winter months and would encourage those on packed lunches to make a change.

Menus are always on our school web site.

- **Packed Lunches** a reminder of the following: We encourage parents to provide healthy well balanced packed lunches. Preparing a healthy well balanced child's lunchbox, includes:
  - Starchy foods – these are bread, rice, potatoes, pasta etc
  - Protein foods – including meat, fish, eggs, beans etc
  - A dairy item – this could be cheese or a yoghurt
  - Vegetables or salad
  - A portion of fruit
  - A healthy drink such as water or milk

Packed lunches and break time snacks MUST NOT include:

- Nuts – including peanut butter and Nutella – because of the life threatening risk to any other child who may have a severe allergy.
- Confectionery such as chocolate bars and sweets.
- Fizzy drinks
- Crisps

### Foods suitable for packed lunches



- **Milk** is vital for growing children as it strengthens bones and teeth. Children in Reception and Nursery are entitled to free milk as are children who are eligible for free school meals and clothing vouchers (not the universal free meal for all Reception & KS1 children).

- The cost of milk for next term is **£15** and needs to be paid by **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2026** via ParentPay NOT cash or cheque. Due to the administrative burden of checking attendance and the inability to change the

order daily unfortunately milk money cannot be refunded for absence.

- Snack money for Nursery and Reception is **£15** for this half term. This is paid on ParentPay and please pay by **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2026**.



- Fruit is **£15.00** for this half term, again payable on ParentPay by **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2026**. This is for playtime snacks.

Our popular afternoon childcare provision is afternoon Nursery – see table on the next page –please note these places (**MUST BE BOOKED IN ADVANCE**) with pick up times at 2.15pm and 3.15pm apart from a Friday when it is 3.15pm

**Please note that unfortunately we are unable to offer facilities for packed lunches for Nursery children.**

## Beckstone Primary School Nursery

Morning nursery sessions run every day from:  
8:45 a.m.—11:45 a.m. (3 hours)

If you would like your child to stay in afternoon nursery, our 30 hours runs from Monday morning – Friday lunch time (12:45pm).

Pick up times on Monday – Thursday afternoons are 2:15pm or 3:15pm. If you are entitled to 30 hours there will be no charge for these sessions.

Unfortunately, there is no option for 2:15pm pick up on a Friday.

The cost for a Friday afternoon is £7.50.

The cost of a lunch is £2.50 to be paid via Parentpay.

If you are not entitled to 30 hours and your child attends afternoon nursery you will be charged as follows:

£2.50 per day for a school dinner

£11.50 (plus £2.50 for dinner) until 2:15pm

£15.50 (plus £2.50 for dinner) until 3:15pm

Unfortunately, there is no option for 2:15pm pick up on a Friday.

There would only be a charge if you go over your 15 hours in the week.

15/30 hours can be used for Breakfast Club and Beckstone Xtra until Friday 12:45pm or banked for Summer Camp (this must be agreed in advance).

Please inform the office as soon as your child starts if you are doing this.

## Extended Services Debts

## Bookings after Deadlines

## UKS2 Carol Service & Complaints

Unfortunately, the rain on the last Wednesday of last term was torrential and not conducive to walking to Church for rehearsals or indeed the advertised Service as the children would have been soaked 3 times before collection and the props would have been ruined. The decision was taken to therefore hold this in school. We realise this might have been inconvenient for some but we felt we had little choice and not being in control of the inclement weather this should not have been a focus of complaint from a small group of parents. The only other option would have been to cancel which would, we are sure, have been even more unpopular. At all times we strive to do our best for pupils and their interests must come first.

Another source of complaints was the end of the day collection after this event. The organisation of collections in a very small collection space at the back of the hall, keeping account of the children who have been taken and dealing with requests to collect siblings early and disrupting other classes could have led to chaos and the potential of losing track of a child. Again, whilst it may have caused a slight inconvenience to some the greater good was ensuring the safety of all. Please show some understanding when speaking to school staff about this if this happens again in the future.





