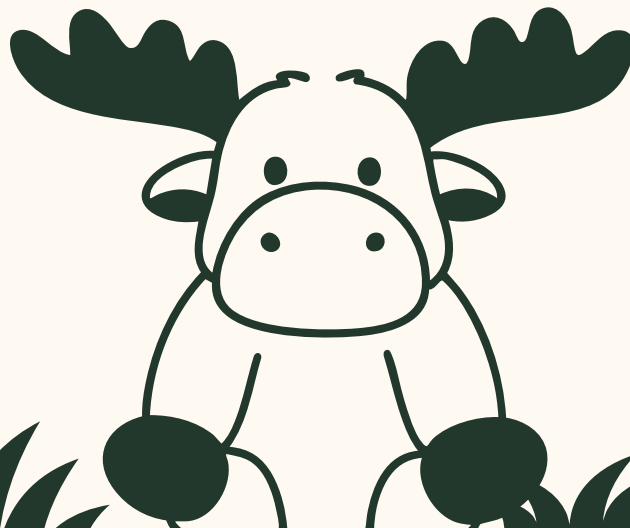

As the car cruises down the road, keep your eyes peeled and your brain buzzing - nature's magic is all around you.



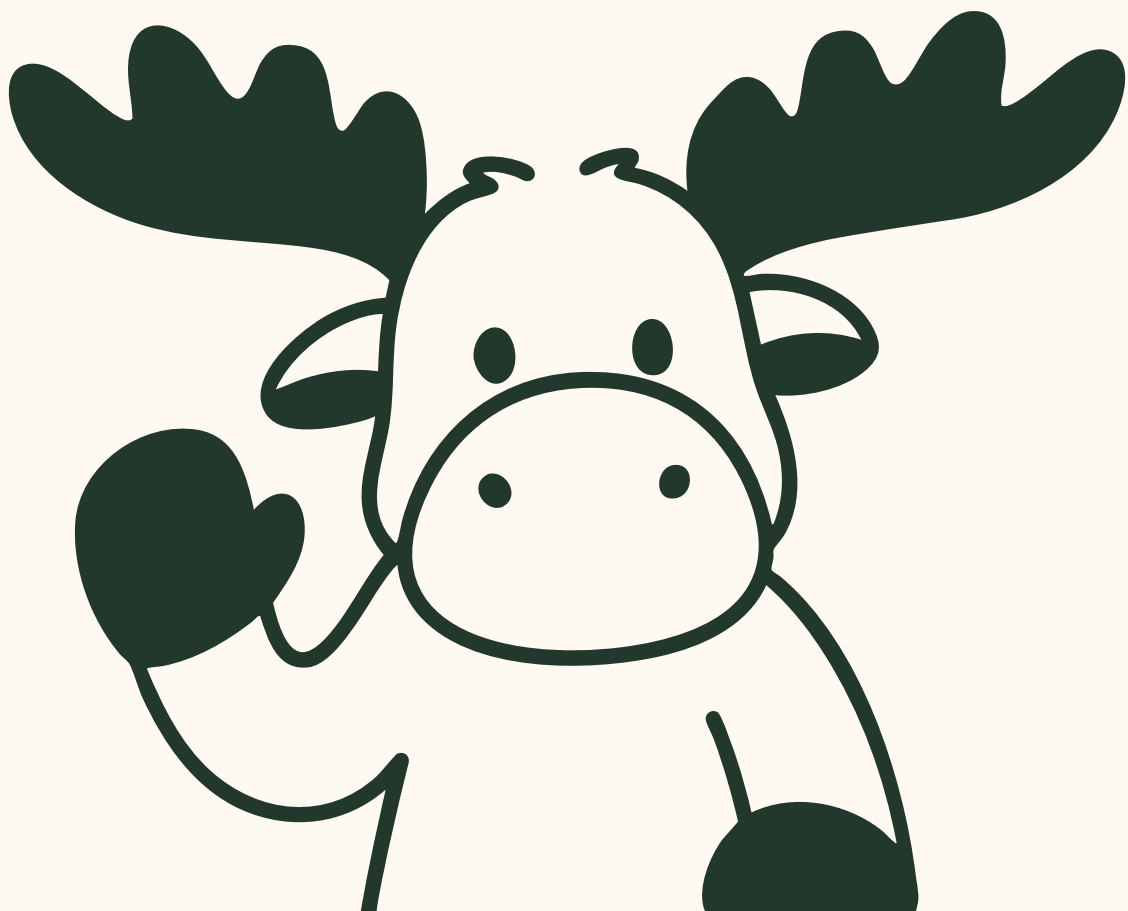


Hi there, I'm Monty the Moose!

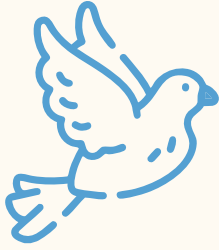

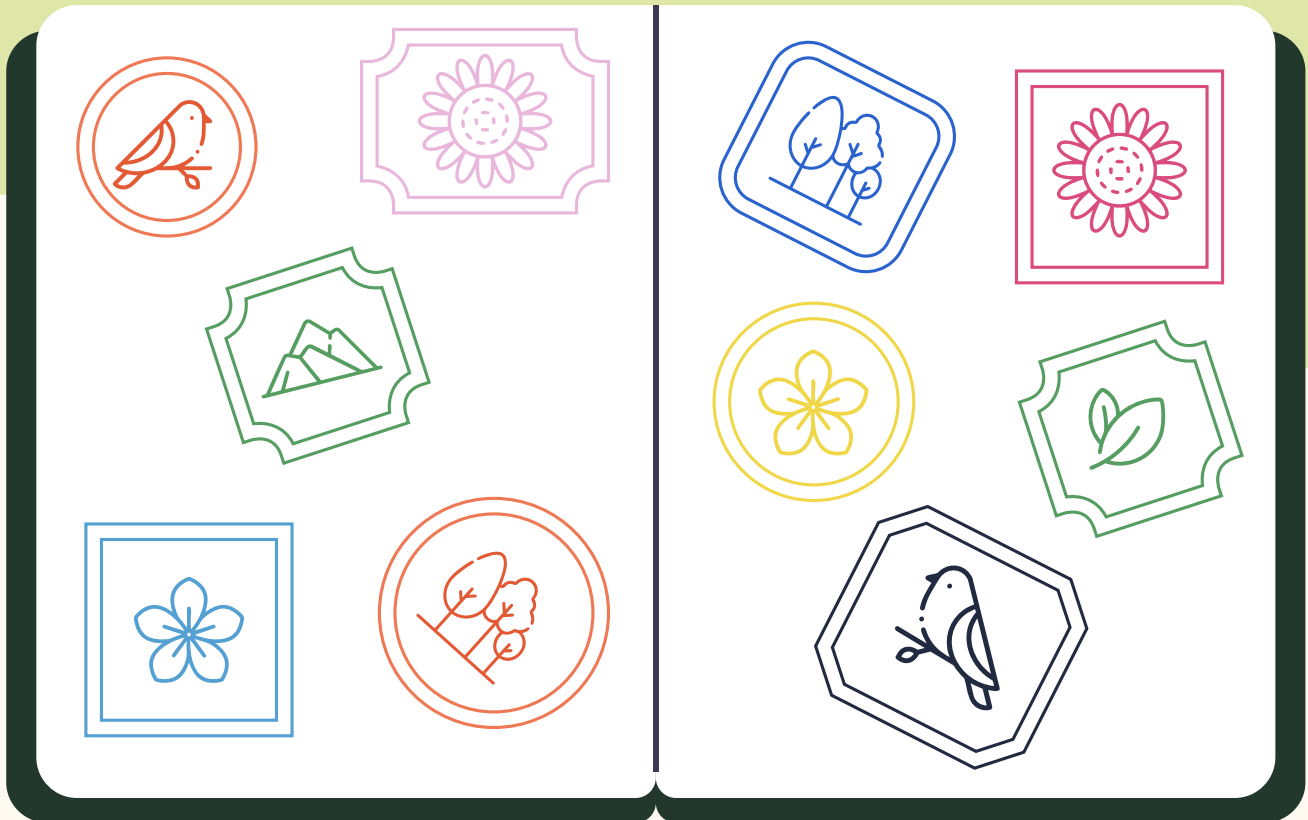

Or... if you find something special on a walk or a break from the car – like a leaf, twig, or flower – ask an adult if you can stick it into your passport.

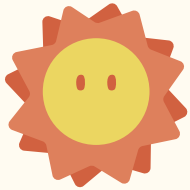

Car Window Safari

Spot, score, and explore on the go!

A message from **Steve Backshall**, the official ambassador for Volvo Car UK's Roadside Nature campaign: "Here's one of my favourite games to play with my kids on car journeys – it's simple, fun, and a bit magical. All you need to do is keep your eyes peeled for wildlife as you travel. The rarer the spot, the more points you score – however – remember spotting lots of pigeons or seagulls could also rack up points and win the game."



How to play

1. Look out of the car windows (safely!) as you travel.
2. Shout out what you see - animals, birds, even interesting trees.
3. Use the score guide below to collect points.
4. Keep a tally - the person with the most points at the end of the holiday wins.

Spotting Scoreboard

Volvo safety note: Always keep your seatbelt on and never lean out of the window. Let the grown-ups focus on the road!

Wildlife	Points	Score
Pigeon, Crow, Gulls	1 point
Rabbit, Squirrel, Magpie, Oak Tree	3 points
Deer, Blackbird, Horse Chestnut	7 points
Fox, Badger, Owl, Heron	10 points
Red Kite, Buzzard, Hare, Willow Tree	15 points

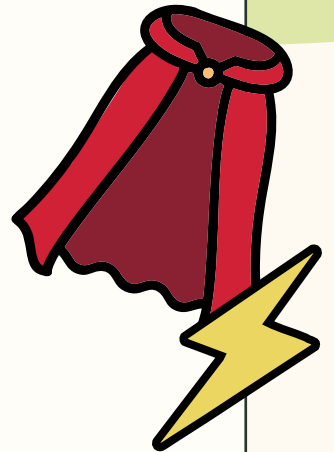

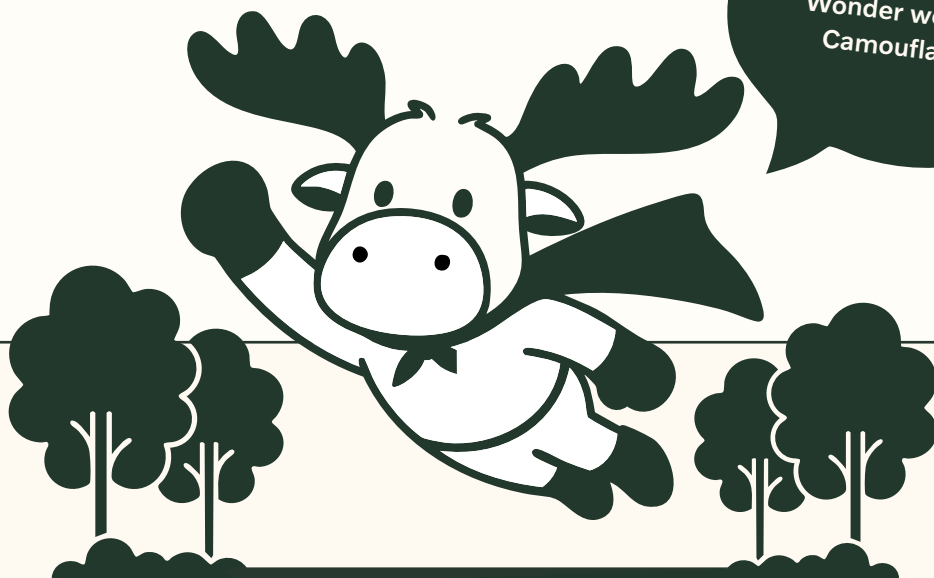

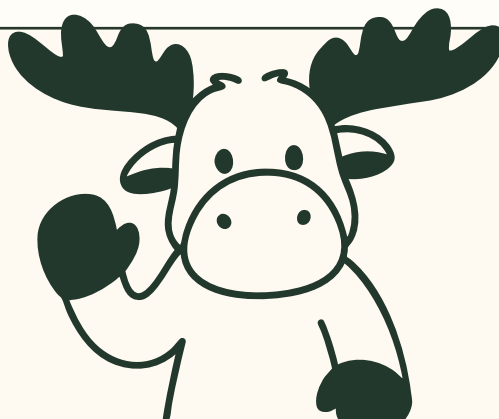

Wonder Words Glossary

Explore, learn, remember!

These Wonder Words have popped up across your adventure.
But what do they mean? Let's find out!

Forage

What it means: To look around for food.

Example: The squirrel foraged in the grass for acorns to eat.

Burrow

What it means: A hole or tunnel that an animal digs to live or hide in.

Example: The rabbit hopped into its burrow to stay safe from the fox.

Flutter

What it means: To flap wings quickly and lightly.

Example: A butterfly fluttered past the car window, dancing in the breeze.

Camouflage

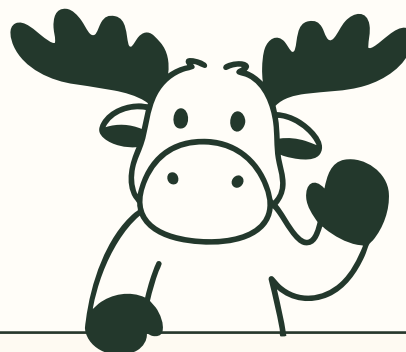
What it means: When something's colours or patterns help it blend into its surroundings.

Example: The lizard changed its colours so it could camouflage against the rocks and stay hidden.

Habitat

What it means: The place where an animal or plant naturally lives.

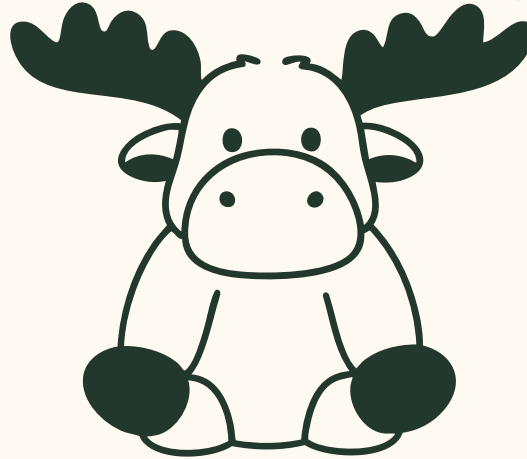
Example: A pond is a frog's habitat - it's where it finds food and lays its eggs.

Parent Tips & Mindful Moments

Reflect, connect, support!

Ideas to help children get the most from the journey:

Ask open questions like:

‘What surprised you today?’ or
‘What was the most unusual thing you saw?’

Encourage them to use their senses:

‘What does that flower smell like?’ or
‘How does the wind sound today?’

Try a quiet moment:

‘Close your eyes and listen for 30 seconds.
What can you hear?’

Let them lead the way:

‘What do you want to look for next?’

Record the moment:

Suggest they draw it, write a few words, or take a picture.
