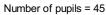

# Percentage of pupils achieving higher standard in reading, writing and maths, 2017-2019



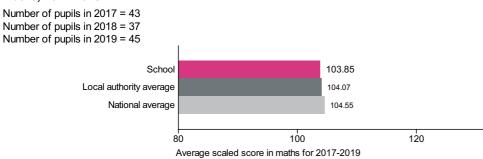

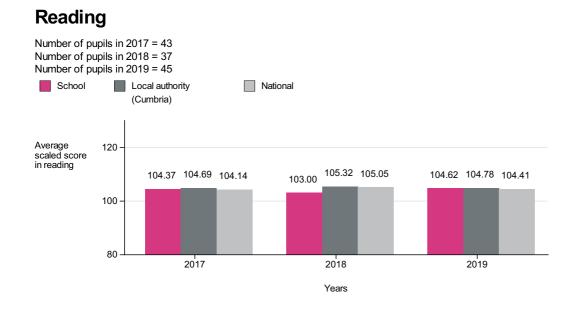
# Percentage of pupils achieving the expected standard or higher



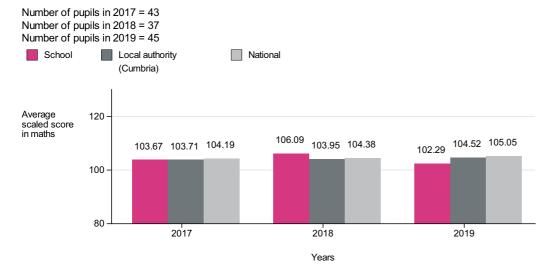

# Percentage achieving greater depth in reading



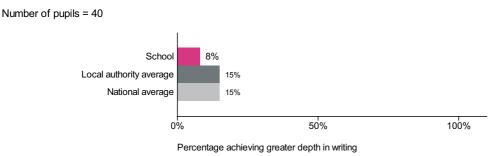

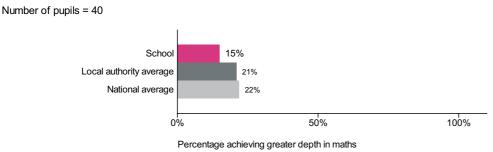

# Percentage achieving the expected standard in phonics

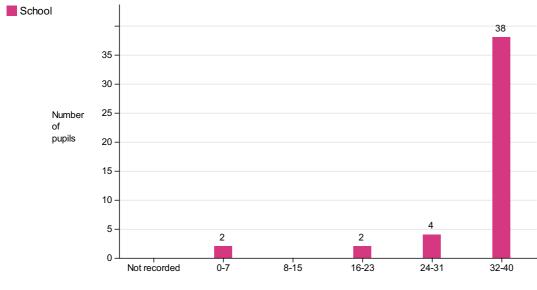
